



The following document is part of a Dulwich Society project to digitise, transcribe and translate the Dulwich Manorial Court Rolls. They begin in 1333 and continue, with some breaks, to 1908.

In this case, the document is evidence of the existence of a lost Roll, rather than a Roll itself.

Text in **red**, apart from modern notes by the transcriber, indicates text missing from, or entirely illegible in, the original document.

Text in various shades of **grey** indicates text which, in the original document, is to a greater or lesser extent difficult to decipher.

Text in **green** indicates letters missed out of the original text, usually in commonly found abbreviations.

Otherwise, all contemporaneous text is in **black**, except for presumed later additions which are indicated in **brown** or **blue**.

Roll

N.B. This Roll is not extant, and what follows are copies of extracts from the roll made in each case for the copyholder concerned as his title deed. There appear to have been two court sessions this month, three days apart.

This extract is Muniment 228 in Warner's Catalogue, dated 2 Oct 1424 :

Dyllewyssh Ad curiam ibidem tenta die Lune proxima post festum sancti Michaelis Archangeli anno regni Regis Henrici sexti post conquestum tercio venit Johannes Elys & Johanna uxor eius & sursum reddit in manus domini unum tenementum vocatum Brounyng & quatuor acris terre cum pertinenciis Unde accidit domino nomine heriette tamen quantum debent de redditus per annum pro eo quod predicti Johannes & Johanna nullia habuunt animalia ad opus Johannis Bruton Et habet derte per virgam in plena curia habendum & tenendum sibi & suis ad voluntatem domini secundum consuetudinem manerii .....

*[In 1424, Michaelmas (29 September) fell on a Friday.]*

This extract is Muniment 229 in Warner's Catalogue, dated 5 Oct 1424 :

Dylewyssh ¶ Ad curiam cum Visum Francplegii ibidem tenta die Jovis proxima ante festum sancte Fidio anno regni Regis Henrici sexti post conquestum tercio testatum est per ballivum ibidem Johannem Colkoc Simonem Dockynge & Willelmum Lane <sup>/tenentes/</sup> quod Elianora Wodesere propter infyrmitatem non potuit ad Curiam accedere sursum reddit in manus domini unam peciam terre continentem Unam acram & dimiditate terre iacentem in le Aps iuxta Langebourne ad opus Henrici Lake Et habet .....

*[In 1424, St Faith's day (6 October) fell on a Friday.]*
