



The following document is part of a Dulwich Society project to digitise, transcribe and translate the Dulwich Manorial Court Rolls. They begin in 1333 and continue, with some breaks, to 1908.

In this case, the document is evidence of the existence of a lost Roll, rather than a Roll itself.

Text in **red**, apart from modern notes by the transcriber, indicates text missing from, or entirely illegible in, the original document.

Text in various shades of **grey** indicates text which, in the original document, is to a greater or lesser extent difficult to decipher.

Otherwise, all contemporaneous text is in **black**, except for presumed later additions which are indicated in **brown** or **blue**.

Roll

N.B. This Roll is not extant, and what follows is a copy of an extract from the roll made for the copyholder concerned as his title deed.

The extract is Muniment 255 in Warner's Catalogue :

To the Court with View, held there on Tuesday in the feast of the Apostles Simon & Jude, in the 27th regnal Year of king Henry VI, came Richard Wythyr, & surrendered into the lord's hands two acres of land, with appurtenances, lying in Lytel croft, abutting upon land of the lord of Dulwiche towards the east and a parcel of Agnes Dene's on the north side, to the benefit of John Brutone, to whom seisin thereof was conceded by the rod in open Court, To hold to himself & his [heirs] at the will of the lord, according to the custom of the manor, by the rent & services therefor [formerly] owed & accustomed. And he gave 8d as a fine, called relief, for having entry. And he made fealty to the lord, & he was admitted

[In 1449, the feast of Saints Simon & Jude (28 October) fell on a Tuesday. My original reading of the regnal year was 'xxvij', not 'xxviiij', but Warner dates this to 1449]
