



The following document is part of a Dulwich Society project to digitise, transcribe and translate the Dulwich Manorial Court Rolls. They begin in 1333 and continue, with some breaks, to 1908.

In this case, the document is evidence of the existence of a lost Roll, rather than a Roll itself.

Text in **red**, apart from modern notes by the transcriber, indicates text missing from, or entirely illegible in, the original document.

Text in various shades of **grey** indicates text which, in the original document, is to a greater or lesser extent difficult to decipher.

Otherwise, all contemporaneous text is in **black**, except for presumed later additions which are indicated in **brown** or **blue**.

N.B. This Roll is not extant, and what follows are copies of extracts from the roll made in each case for the copyholder concerned as his title deed.

The following extract is Muniment 297 in Warner's Catalogue, not yet transcribed:

Dilwich. At the View of Frankpledge with Court, held there on the 19th day of October in the Twelfth Year of Edward IV, Thomas Newman and his wife Elizabeth surrendered one acre in Twaycrochyn to the use of John Brutone, his wife Joan, and John Dove [?and the heirs and assigns of the said John Dove]. [Entry fine: ??]

The following is from Roll F2 [previously E2] (recto), ll. 57-61, for 17 January 1521, which refers to a transaction of this earlier date :

At this Court the Jurors present that John Legh, knight, holds & occupies 4 acres of land lying in the Nappse (by what right & title the Jurors do not know), & that the aforesaid 4 acres of land are held by Copy of the Court at the will of the lord, according to the custom of the manor, & that Ralph Legh, father of the same, so held it, as appears by the Roll of the Court Dated the nineteenth day of October in the 12th regnal year of King Edward IV [i.e. 19 Oct 1472], &c.
