



The following document is part of a Dulwich Society project to digitise, transcribe and translate the Dulwich Manorial Court Rolls. They begin in 1333 and continue, with some breaks, to 1908.

In this case, the document is evidence of the existence of a lost Roll, rather than a Roll itself.

Text in **red**, apart from modern notes by the transcriber, indicates text missing from, or entirely illegible in, the original document.

Text in various shades of **grey** indicates text which, in the original document, is to a greater or lesser extent difficult to decipher.

Otherwise, all contemporaneous text is in **black**, except for presumed later additions which are indicated in **brown** or **blue**.

N.B. This Roll is not extant, and what follows is a copy of an extract from the roll made for the copyholder concerned as his title deed.

The extract is Muniment 235 in Warner's Catalogue :

Delewyssh To the court held there on the 12 day of November, in the 15th regnal year of King Edward 4th, comes Elizabeth (the wife of Thomas) Hale, kinswoman & heir of Joan, late the wife of Eli Ingolf, namely the daughter & heir of William Webbe, the brother & heir of the aforesaid Joan, and seeks to be admitted to 4 acres of land in Delewyssh, lying in 2 parcels in a certain croft called Lytylcroft, otherwise Lytylmiddyfeld, of which the said Joan died seised And upon this the homage, charged with the premises, say upon their Oath
