N.B. This Roll is not extant, but the transaction below is referred to in Muniment 210, and in Rolls J9 [previously K7] (front), ll. 69 to 73 (for 26 Oct 1584) and J10 [previously L1] (back), ll. 10 to 14 (for 22 Oct 1586).

Thomas Ode, customary tenant of this manor, At the court held within this manor on the eleventh day of April in the twenty-fourth Regnal Year of our now lady Queen, in his own person, Surrendered eleven acres of land lying at Howletts bridge with appurtenances, To the benefit & use of the aforesaid Edmund Bowyer, of his heirs, & of his assigns in perpetuity, whereby befalls to the Lady as a heriot one mare worth --- 40s ...

[Thomas Ode seems to have forgotten that his wife Elizabeth was joint owner with him, but at the manor court held on 26 Oct 1584 she surrendered to Edmund Bowyer whatever interest she still had or might have in the property.]
