¶ At the view of Frank pledge with Court Baron of Francis Calton, Esquire of his manor of Dulwytche aforesaid, there held on Monday, namely the twelfth day of May in the Thirty-seventh Year of the Reign of our Lady Elizabeth, by the grace of god Queen of England, France & Ireland, Defender of the faith, &c., in the presence of John Adye, gentleman, Steward there, is thus enrolled :

Manor of Dulwytch. ¶ At this Court the Lord, by his Steward, according to the Custom of the aforesaid Manor, Granted a licence to Nicholas Knight, gentleman, one of the Customary tenants of this Manor, and the same Nicholas Knight [was] licensed to demise to farm to William Addams of the parish of Saint Brides in London, to the greatest profit & Advantage of the same Nicholas, all his Customary messuage or tenement in Dulwytche aforesaid, and all & singular the buildings, structures, houses, gardens, orchards, Curtileges, lands, fields, leas, meadows, pastures, woodlands, & all other his Customary hereditaments, with the aforesaid appurtenances, to the messuage or tenement belonging or pertaining, lying & being in Dulwytch aforesaid, & which were lately in the occupation of Roger Hamonde or of his assigns, from the feast of Saint Michael Archangel last past before this Court, for a term of twenty & one years from then next following & fully completed & ended, To have & to hold to the same William Addams & his assigns for & during the whole of the aforesaid term. And he Gave the Lord 20s as a fine for obtaining such a licence, according to the custom of the aforesaid Manor. And he has licence therefor in the aforesaid form at this Court, from the Concession & agreement of the Lord &c
