



The following document is part of a Dulwich Society project to digitise, transcribe and translate the Dulwich Manorial Court Rolls. They begin in 1333 and continue, with some breaks, to 1903.

In this case, the document is evidence of the existence of a lost Roll, rather than a Roll itself.

Text in **red**, apart from modern notes by the transcriber, indicates text missing from, or entirely illegible in, the original document.

Text in various shades of **grey** indicates text which, in the original document, is to a greater or lesser extent difficult to decipher.

Otherwise, all contemporaneous text is in **black**, except for presumed later additions which are indicated in **brown** or **blue**.

'Roll' N14 [This 'Roll' was previously the second of two both named WW.] [It is not a proper Roll, but was obviously intended as a final draft of Roll N11 [previously WW(1)], Part 4. It comprises a single sheet.]

Also, they present William Holt and Daniel Wood to be headboroughs for the ensuing Year who, absent on a certificate of a Justice of the peace for taking the oath, are under penalty of [?]40d if they do not undertake the oath before the twentieth of June next, &c.

Also, they present Thomas Smyth to be Aleconner for the ensuing year who, present, undertook his oath.
