



The following document is part of a Dulwich Society project to digitise, transcribe and translate the Dulwich Manorial Court Rolls. They begin in 1333 and continue, with some breaks, to 1903.

In this case, the document is evidence of the existence of a lost Roll, rather than a Roll itself.

Text in **red**, apart from modern notes by the transcriber, indicates text missing from, or entirely illegible in, the original document.

Text in various shades of **grey** indicates text which, in the original document, is to a greater or lesser extent difficult to decipher.

Otherwise, all contemporaneous text is in **black**, except for presumed later additions which are indicated in **brown** or **blue**.

'Roll' N16 [previously XD] [This is not a proper Roll, but was obviously intended as a final draft of a no longer extant Roll. It comprises a single sheet, folded once to form four pages.]

At this Court it is presented that Rachel Bennet, one of the Custumary
tenants of this Manor, effected a waste in felling ^{and selling} timber to the value

of six pounds and eight shillings, but because it is agreed with the Court that she has spent the aforesaid six pounds and eight shillings in repairing the tenements, and seven pounds twelve shillings more, the Lords of the aforesaid Manor, on her humble supplication, for a fine of 10s paid to them into Court, have remitted the aforesaid[?] forfeiture to the aforesaid Rachel

Bennet .
