



The following document is part of a Dulwich Society project to digitise, transcribe and translate the Dulwich Manorial Court Rolls. They begin in 1333 and continue, with some breaks, to 1903.

In this case, the document is evidence of the existence of a lost Roll, rather than a Roll itself.

Text in **red**, apart from modern notes by the transcriber, indicates text missing from, or entirely illegible in, the original document.

Text in various shades of **grey** indicates text which, in the original document, is to a greater or lesser extent difficult to decipher.

Otherwise, all contemporaneous text is in **black**, except for presumed later additions which are indicated in **brown** or **blue**.

'Roll' N17 [previously XE] [This is not a proper Roll, but was obviously intended as a draft of a no longer extant Roll, and is presumably a continuation (or correction of part) of 'Roll' N16 [previously XD]. It comprises a single sheet, folded once to form four pages.]

At this Court Rachell Bennett, one of the Custumary tenants of this Manor, having committed a forfeiture by felling of timber on her Custumary estate held of this Manor, which she sold for £6 8s, and it appearing that she has bestowed about fourteen pounds on her Custumary messuage held of this Manor in lieu thereof, At this Court she did Compound with the Lords for the said offence, and was excused for her said offence, paying ten shillings fine to the Lords of the Manor
