The General Customary Court of the Governors of Alleyns College at Dulwich Lords of the said x Manor hold of the College in Dulwich in and for the said Manor on Monday the first day of ccc August in the twenty eighth year of the reign of Queen Victoria and in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty four _ Before *Charles Druce* Gentleman Steward there
No Tenant appearing

Whereas at a General Court holden for this Manor on Thursday the twenty first day of June One thousand eight hundred and ten a certain Surrender made out of Court by Robert Wilson one of the Customary Tenants of the Manor was presented and enrolled . Whereby the said Robert Wilson for the considerations therein


expressed did surrender All that brick and timber messuage with the Coachouse Stable Washouse and other outhouses thereunto belonging garden orchard and meadow thereto adjoining containing together two acres little more or less situate on the north side of Dulwich Common with the appurtenances then in the occupation of Alison Marshall To the use of Allison Allen Marshall and her assigns for her life and after her decease to the use of William Elliott of Billiter Lane London Esquire his heirs and assigns according to the custom of the Manor And at the same Court the said Allison Allen Marshall was admitted to the said premises And also to All that piece or parcel of Waste Land *cc* theretofore enclosed N^o 86^a containing twenty seven perches bounded on the north east by the Homestead of the said Allison Allen Marshall On the west and south^{west} by the road towards Sydenham and on the south east by an Allotment to the College And also to all that Allotment or parcel of Waste land N^o 238 containing two roods and two perches *cc* situate on Dulwich Common bounded on the West by the Allotment to Ann Wright Spinster on the north east by an Allotment to William Hudson Esquire by him exchanged and old Enclosures of the College in the occupation of William Orme and on the south east by the road towards Hall lane which two pieces of waste land were allotted to the said Allison Allen Marshall in respect of the said copyhold tenements so surrendered to her by an Award under the Act for inclosing lands in the Manor of Dulwich To hold the said several premises to the said Allison Allen Marshall and her assigns during her natural life according to the form of the said Surrender

The Court here is informed that the said Allison Allen Marshall who afterwards became the Wife of John Castondieck Esquire departed this life on the fourth day of *cc* August One thousand eight hundred and fifty nine .

And the Court here is further informed that the said William Elliott departed this life on the seventeenth day of August One thousand eight hundred and eleven but who is his heir is to the Court unknown

Whereupon Proclamation was duly made at this Court for any person or persons having right to the said premises to claim the same and come in and be admitted to the same . But no one came . Wherefore the default is recorded and the second Proclamation will be made at the next Court



The third Proclamation on death of Allison Allen Marshall afterwards Castondieck ----- Order for Warrant for seizure

The third Proclamation was made at this Court for any or persons claiming title to the hereditaments whereof Allison Allen Castondieck formerly Allison Allen Marshall died seized to claim the same and come in and be admitted to the same . But no one came _ Wherefore this third default is recorded _ And it is declared that the said hereditaments have become forfeited to the Lords for want of a tenant And it is ordered that the usual Warrant of seizure be done

Admission of Thomas Watson Parker in trust under order in Chancery to Copyhold late of Allison Allen Marshall afterwards Castondieck

It is alleged and it appears by the Rolls of this Manor That as a General Court Baron holden for this Manor on the twenty first day of June One thousand eight hundred and ten the Homage there and then presented a certain Surrender made by Robert Wilson Esquire one of the customary tenants of the Manor and taken out of Court on the twenty eighth day of February One thousand eight hundred and nine Whereby the said Robert Wilson for the consideration therein expressed did surrender into the hands of the Lords All that brick and timber messuage with the Coachhouse Stable Washhouse and *ccc* other outhouses thereunto belonging Garden Orchard and Meadow thereto adjoining *ccc* containing by estimation two acres little more or less situate and being on the north side of Dulwich Common with the appurtenances then in the occupation of Allison Marshall and all the estate of the said Robert Wilson therein **T**o the use of Allison Allen Marshall of Dulwich Spinster Daughter of the said Allison Marshall and her assigns during the term of her natural life And from and immediately after the *cc* decease of the said Allison Allen Marshall **T**o the use of William Elliott of Billiter Lane London Esquire his heirs and assigns for ever according to the custom of the

Manor but subject to a certain Lease thereof which has long since expired Nevertheless to the intent that the said William Elliott his heirs and assigns should stand seized of the same premises from and after the decease of the said Allison Allen Marshall upon certain trusts declared thereof by an Indenture therein referred to and bearing even date with the said Surrender And at the same Court came the said Allison Allen Marshall in person and prayed to be admitted to the premises by such Surrender particularly mentioned And at the same Court the said Allison Allen Marshall also prayed to be admitted to All that piece or parcel of waste land theretofore enclosed N^o 86^a containing twenty seven perches bounded on the north east by the Homestead of the said Allison Allen Marshall on the west and south west by the road towards Sydenham and on the south east by an Allotment to the Master Warden Fellows Brethren Sisters and Scholars of the College of Gods Gift in Dulwich And also to all that Allotment or parcel of Waste land N^o 238 containing two roods and two perches situate on Dulwich Common bounded on the West by the allotment to Ann Wright Spinster on the north east by an Allotment to William Hudson Esquire by him exchanged and old enclosures of the said Master Warden Fellows Brethren Sisters and Scholars in the occupation of William Orme and on the south east by the road leading towards Hall Lane which two pieces or parcels of waste land had been allotted to the said Allison Allen Marshall in respect of the said copyhold tenements by an Award made in pursuance of an Act of Parliament for enclosing lands in the Manor of Dulwich And thereupon the said Allison Allen Marshall was admitted tenant to All and singular the premises so surrendered by the said Robert Wilson and also to the said two pieces or parcels of waste land and premises so allotted as aforesaid To hold the same to her and her assigns for and cc

during the term of her natural life according to the custom of the said Manor at the yearly rent of One shilling and four pence heriot suit of Court and other services due and accustomed And the Court here is informed that the said Allison Allen Marshall afterwards intermarried with and became the Wife of John Castondieck Esquire and that the said Allison Allen the Wife of the said John Castondieck departed this life on or about
