



Termination of Membership Procedure

Membership of the Society comes to an end if the Society's Trustees (the Executive Committee) decide that it is in the best interests of the Society that the member in question should be removed from membership, and pass a resolution to that effect. This may arise, for example, because of serious or persistent breaches of the Code of Conduct, refusal to change behaviour or multiple complaints relating to the member.

Before the Executive Committee takes any decision to remove someone from membership of the Society they must:

1. inform the member of the reasons why it is proposed to remove him or her from membership;
2. give the member at least 21 clear days notice in which to make representations to the Executive Committee as to why he or she should not be removed from membership;
3. at a duly constituted meeting of the Executive Committee, consider whether or not the member should be removed from membership (the Quorum for an Executive Committee meeting is 5);
4. consider at that meeting any representations which the member makes as to why the member should not be removed; and
5. allow the member, or the member's representative, to make those representations in person at that meeting, if the member so chooses.

Where a decision is taken to remove an individual's membership, their household membership will cease. Other members of the household may re-apply to the Membership Secretary for personal membership.
